NOTICE OF INITIATION

IN THE MATTER OF a complaint, pursuant to Sections 22 and 23 of the *Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1999*, submitted by Caribbean Cement Company Limited to the Anti-Dumping and Subsidies Commission;

AND IN THE MATTER OF initiation of a case by the Anti-Dumping and Subsidies Commission pursuant to Sections 22 and 23 of the *Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1999*;

IN RESPECT OF the dumping in Jamaica of Ordinary Portland Grey Cement, originating in or exported from the Dominican Republic, usually classified under Harmonized Tariff Schedule Code: 2523.291.

DECISION TO INITIATE

On April 30, 2010, pursuant to Section 22 of the *Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1999*, the Anti-Dumping and Subsidies Commission, hereinafter called "the Commission", by a majority, initiated an investigation in respect of the alleged injurious dumping into Jamaica of the aforementioned goods, originating in or exported from the Dominican Republic. A Statement of Reasons explaining this decision is provided to persons directly interested in these proceedings. A copy may be obtained by contacting the Commission, or from the Commission's website at www.jadsc.gov.jm.

INFORMATION

Interested parties are invited to file written submissions presenting facts, arguments, and evidence relevant to this investigation. Written submissions should be forwarded to the Commission at the address indicated above. In order to be given consideration in this phase of the investigation, all information should be received by the Commission within thirty (30) days of the date of initiation. Information submitted to the Commission by interested parties concerning this investigation is deemed to be public unless clearly marked and treated as "Confidential". Interested persons should contact the Commission for information on procedures to file submissions.

SCHEDULE

The Commission will terminate or make a Preliminary Determination and examine whether a provisional measure is appropriate in the case within ninety (90) days from the date of initiation, or until July 29, 2010, unless extended. The Commission has until October 27, 2010, or a further ninety (90) days from the date of the preliminary determination, if any, to complete this investigation, unless extended.
